Mayor and Council:

On Wednesday October 23rd, City staff met with representatives from the Ministry of Transportation (MTO) to further discuss the cost sharing for the design and construction of a public access onto Hwy 65E in order to extend Grant Drive, from Wilson Drive to the highway. The original proposed Cost Sharing Agreement (CSA) for the work required at the Grant Drive – Hwy 65E intersection was deemed to be unsatisfactory by Staff and Council and the Ministry was advised that the City were prepared to release a Request for Proposals for the required work.

The Ministry subsequently requested that the City reconsider its position and at the direction of the PW Committee and Council, a proposed cost sharing arrangement was submitted for Ministry consideration (Attachment 01).

As outlined in earlier memorandums to Council, the MTO has entered into an agreement with a Consultant for the purpose of rehabilitation design of Highway 11, from 0.8 kilometres north of the junction of Highway 65 (Golf Course Road), northerly for 11 kilometres, to the south junction of Highway 569 (Project GWP 5041-17-00). Preliminary project initiation meetings and field surveys have started and anticipated construction is scheduled for the spring of 2022.

Any work to be completed at the Grant Drive / Highway 65E intersections is considered "outside" the limits of the current work project and the Ministry are required to enter into an Agreement with a Third Party Consultant to complete the design work and then include it within the eventual construction project to be completed in 2022.

Grant Drive Extension at Highway 65E, Proposed Intersection

Based on the recommendations outlined in the Paradigm Study, and reviewed by the Ministry, the construction of a left turn lane (east bound on Hwy 65E) and a right-hand taper (west bound on Hwy 65E) are required should the City proceed with the construction of Grant Drive from Wilson Drive to Hwy 65E.

The preliminary cost estimate for the design and construction of these features at this intersection could be as high as \$594K and based on the initial proposal from the Ministry the City's portion (as per a proposed CSA) was estimated to be approximately \$504K.

October 23rd Discussions

Further to the City's correspondence to the Ministry dated October 15th (Attachment 02) and the discussions held on October 23rd, the Ministry is prepared to enter into a CSA that includes covering 100% of the Design costs, 100% of the Contract Administration costs and 50% of the Construction costs or \$369,000 of the estimated \$594,000 leaving the City with an estimated \$225,000 construction cost.

Staff are recommending the following;

- 1. That Council approve entering into a formal Cost Sharing Agreement with the MTO as per the discussions held on October 23rd whereby the Ministry will assign the design of the required works to a third party, pre-approved Consultant and include the construction of the Highway 65E – Grant Drive Intersection with Project GWP 5041-17-00, with an estimated construction date of 2022; and
- That Council authorizes staff to negotiate an Agreement, with the Ministry appointed Consultant, for the design of the Grant Drive extension to coincide with the Highway 65E intersection work.





Dear Ms. Beaupre,

Further to our meeting of August 1st, 2019 and subsequent correspondence regarding the above noted subject, I have received direction from Mayor and Council to continue discussions with your Ministry in hopes of entering into a mutually beneficial cost sharing arrangement for the design and construction of roadworks along Highway 65E near the proposed Grant Drive extension.

At this time the City understands that the Ministry wishes to utilize the services of a Consultant that has been retained to complete similar work and, in the best interest of both parties, could be engaged in the design of the works required to allow for the intersection and access of the proposed extension of Grant Drive onto Highway 65E. Pending successful negotiations with that same Consultant, the City may also opt to engage their services to complete the design of the Grant Drive extension from Wilson Drive to Highway 65E.

During previous meetings between elected officials from the City and your senior ministry staff, cost sharing for the design and construction had been discussed. The cost sharing discussions of August 1st, focused primarily on the design work for the left turn lane and right hand taper on Highway 65E, however, there was an indication that the Ministry would not be willing to share in the cost of construction and it was due to this fact that City council opted to advise the Ministry of their decision to decline your offer.

Through follow-up discussions between yourself, other Ministry staff and City staff, Council has agreed to re-consider further discussions which would include the Ministry providing 100% funding for the design of the required intersection work and 50% of the related construction costs (with a projected 2022 construction time frame) within the Highway 65E easement.

I look forward to meeting with you and Ministry staff on October 23rd to further discuss this arrangement. Should you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

Subject: Release of Tender – Dymond Water Linking Project – Phase 2 & 3

Mayor and Council:

At the Regular Council meeting held on May 7, 2019, Council directed Staff to issue a Purchase Order to EXP for engineering Services related to the Design of Phase 2 & 3 of the Dymond Linking Project. Currently the design is complete and the project is ready for tender. The total cost of this project is estimated at \$1,875,000.

At the Regular Council meeting held on July 9, 2019, Council supported submissions of funding applications to NOHFC in the amount of \$937,500 and to FedNor in the amount of \$750,000 to complete Phase 2 & 3 of the Dymond Linking Project. The City's portion of the project would be \$187,500 and has been included in Staff's initial draft of the 2020 budget to be presented to Council for consideration. Both applications were submitted and are currently in the second stage of review. Council support was based on new business growth requests, including the proposed senior housing developments for the Grant Drive and Highway 65 East area.

In October of 2019, construction of the senior housing project commenced with anticipated occupancy being in the Fall of 2020. Therefore, to expediate the process, Staff is recommending that Council approve the release of the Tender for construction of Phase 2 & 3 of the Dymond Linking Project. Within the Tender documents there will be a statement that award of Tender will be subject to funding and budget approval.

Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program – Green Stream Subject:

Mayor and Council:

On October 28, 2019 the Minister of Infrastructure announced the opening for the first intake of funding under the Green Stream of the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP). This funding is for eligible Municipalities with a population under 100,000. The City of Temiskaming Shores qualifies with a Project Funding Cap (total eligible costs) of \$ 2,702,400. The City would be responsible for 26.67% of the total eligible costs or approximately \$ 720,000 should the funding cap be maximized.

In March of 2018 an agreement was entered into with RV Andersen to complete the design of a UV Treatment System for the effluent at the Haileybury Wastewater Treatment Plant (HWTP). This initiative was a result of the Federal Wastewater Systems Effluent Regulations which will not allow any chlorine residual discharged within the effluent effective January of 2021. Currently the design of the UV system is complete and is ready for tender with a construction cost estimate of \$1,400,000.

Within the ICIP Green Stream Program Guide it indicates that priority will be given to projects that address health and safety issues associated with water, wastewater and stormwater infrastructure, the renewal and/or rehabilitation of wastewater treatment facilities are eligible projects. Wastewater projects must result in wastewater effluent that meets the Wastewater Systems Effluent Regulations. The UV System at the HWTP would meet these conditions.

To maximize the funding opportunity, staff contacted RV Andersen to discuss additional work that may be required to optimize the operation of the UV System. As a result, it was suggested that electrical upgrades at the Farr Drive Pumping Station, upsizing the generator for the UV building to include the Farr Drive Pumping Station and the installation of sludge handling equipment be included in the project for Rehabilitation of the Haileybury Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Therefore, it is recommended that Council identifies the Rehabilitation of the Haileybury Wastewater Treatment Plant as a priority project and approves the submission of this project for the first intake of funding under the Green Stream of the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program.
